# Entrepreneurship the core Driving Force of Economy

Mr. Salman F. Rahman, President, Bangladesh Association of Publicly Listed Companies (BAPLC) graced the occasion as Chief Guest. Mr. Matiul Islam FCA, Chairman, Industrial & Infrastructure Development Finance Company Limited conducted the Seminar as Session Chairman. Mr. Abdul Mannan, Professor University of Liberal Arts, Bangladesh and former Vice Chancellor, Chittagong University, Chittagong presented the keynote paper. Dr. Jamaluddin Ahmed FCA, President, ICAB offered an address of welcome to the audience and

discussed in details the robust growth in entrepreneurship in Bangladesh which he said has given birth to the recent SME concept. Mr. Jamaluddin referred back to the era of Industrial Revolution that took place in the United Kingdom around the 18th Century and spread later to entire Europe and America and commented that great momentum was added to the development of entrepreneurship from that time all the world over. As for Bangladesh Mr. Jamal said that the real economic growth of the country started with the birth of Bangladesh as a sovereign state in 1971 when members of young generation who were running after clerkship during the reign of Pakistan started to promote them-selves as entrepreneurs. ## For Whom the Bell Tolls – In Remembrance of Md Raquibul Husain

*"Each man's death diminishes me,  
For I am involved in mankind.  
Therefore, send not to know  
For whom the bell tolls,  
It tolls for thee."*

John Donne summed it up appropriately many years ago and I indeed feel very diminished at the passing away of Mr. Md. Raquibul Husain. The bell tolled very early for this fine gentleman as he left us without even getting the time to say goodbye.

My first memory of meeting him goes way back to the mid eighties when I had just started practice and one of my first assignments was the audit of the Palli Bidyut Samities under the Rural Electrification Board (REB). I was sent to discuss the draft audit report. I still recall the warm and hospitable manner in which Raquib Bhai greeted us, even though we had never met before, and led us to the conference room. The discussions, as such discussions usually go, went off reasonably smoothly but there were disagreements in certain areas. Instead of trying to impose anything on us, he went to great lengths to dig out REB's policies and explain the basis. The only noticeable sign of discord was a deep sigh perhaps born out of exasperation but he never let us feel uncomfortable. I was indeed very impressed with his politeness, his knowledge and above all his humility.

Since then our paths have crossed many times, the most recent being when he joined the American International School, although it was my sister and fellow Partner, Sanjida, who dealt with him more often than I did. Nevertheless, his e-mails from time to time on various professional and Institute matters would always inspire

and encourage me. In 2004 when I was serving the Institute he made many useful suggestions, many of which I tried to implement. However, it was not all one way appreciation. He was very quick to point out that we were inviting non Chartered Accountants to take up management positions within the Institute which he thought could easily be handled by our members. I shall remember him as a loyal friend and a caring elder brother, besides being extremely courteous and professional.

The day he brought his daughter, Rafia, to our firm to study Chartered Accountancy was perhaps one of the proudest moments of his life. He gushed over the tremendous love and respect he had for this profession and exhorted his daughter to attain this very noble qualification.

Soon thereafter, came the setback and the first signs of his illness. He was admitted to Shikder General Hospital around September 2009 with a severe heart attack. I rushed there in the evening soon after I heard the news and found him very emotional but even in that condition, he warmly welcomed me and spoke highly about me to his family – embarrassingly so. He recovered from that attack but had

to leave his official commitments on doctor's advice. He gradually made the transition arrangements and I wonder if this did not weigh on him somewhat.

My last meeting took place with him in our office in early April 2010 when he came to invite us to the wedding of his very lovely daughter, Rafia, to one of our senior management team, Imtiaz, also a fine young man who completed his ACCA in the UK. I felt very sad to have to tell him that I was going on an overseas trip and wouldn't be around for the wedding. Little did I know that would be our last meeting.

I received the news of his passing away while I was abroad through my sister. For an hour or so I just sat there in shock and stunned disbelief, as tears welled up in my eyes and the ultimate final words in our religion, *Inna lillahi wa inna ilayhi raji'un* -- 'Surely we belong to Allah and to Him shall we return', passed my lips. Not in a long time have I felt so much pain and sorrow on hearing the death news of anyone. Rafia's wedding had taken place just 2 days before and what should have been a happy and joyous household was suddenly transformed into one of gloom. Was it Fate or Providence that had allowed him to stay on and at least see his loving daughter's wedding. Who knows?

What I do know is that he will be mourned not just by his family but by all of us who had come into contact with him and had the privilege of learning from him. The oft repeated clichés like irreparable loss, will be sadly missed by us, etc. will be mentioned, but to me his smiling face and friendship will always be there to inspire and guide me in my moments of adversity. May he be happy in his new home where all of us will have to go one day.

**S**huvo Noboborsho to all. Shushagotom 1417, biday 1416. By bidding goodbye to the 1416, Bengali New Year 1417 comes into being.

Rabindranath Tagore pioneered the idea of celebrating Bangla New Year's Festival in his Shantiniketanschool to create a feeling of unity in the diversity of human existence.

The celebration of Bengali New Year is known as "Pahela Baishakh" or 1st Baishakh. The traditional way of celebrating it is called 'Haal Khata', which means New Ledger. All the storeowners would hold a special celebration on this day.
